Aim: To systematically find evidence-based information on sex and gender aspects for individual drug substances.

| Searches should be done in the following sources: | |

| <input type="checkbox"/> | PubMed – According to standardized search profile (see separate SOP) |
| <input type="checkbox"/> | PubMed – In case of incomplete search results according to search profile, search is done on: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • pivotal clinical studies, incl. supplementary material • other randomized, controlled, clinical studies • systematic reviews, meta-analyses |
| <input type="checkbox"/> | PubMed – In case of incomplete search results, a targeted search is done on: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • pharmacokinetics • effects • adverse effects • influence on women of childbearing age/pregnant and/or their partner (double-check SmPC) • drug-drug interaction between the substance and hormones (double-check Janusmed interactions) |
| <input type="checkbox"/> | Swedish MPA – Swedish SmPC (if nationally approved product) |
| <input type="checkbox"/> | EMA – English SmPC (if centrally approved product) |
| <input type="checkbox"/> | DailyMed – Package leaflets approved by FDA |
| <input type="checkbox"/> | Drugs@FDA – Documentation of FDA-approved drugs |
